
Our work at Australian Institute of Botanical Science makes a difference

The Australian Institute of Botanical Science (AIBS) is Australia's oldest scientific institution, situated on significant historical, ceremonial and traditional trade ground sites.

The Institute is a global leader in botanical science, conservation, research and sustainability.

The Institute drives our science, horticultural and education outcomes.

Impactful projects at AIBS

NSW Tree of Life

Creating the first New South Wales tree of life – a comprehensive phylogeny of the entire flora of NSW. This project capturing the evolutionary history of plants in NSW at this level of detail has never been achieved before and will have global impact.

Rainforest Seed Conservation Project

Actively preserving and restoring the vulnerable rainforest ecosystems that contain more than 50% of Australia's plant biodiversity.

Restore & Renew

Revolutionising land restoration and building resilience against the impact of climate change, natural disasters and urban development using the latest DNA technology.

Stop the Rot

Harnessing innovation to safeguard biodiversity hotspots under threat by Phytophthora root rot, supported by ecological scent dogs trained to detect this devastating pathogen.

Impact that lasts

Australian rainforests are dying faster than ever before, but by supporting our Rainforest Seed Conservation Project, we can make a difference.

Did you know? There are only four remaining wild species of macadamia in eastern Australia!

They are endemic - they do not live anywhere else in the world and the loss of this species will have global repercussions.

These seeds are challenging to bank by traditional methods (drying and freezing) – a problem faced by most rainforest species globally. Our team at the Australian PlantBank is working to find revolutionary methods of conserving macadamia seeds.

In the case of the macadamia, we are attempting to preserve the tiny embryo located within the kernel, rather than the entire seed. This is a unique practice in preservation.

By contributing to our research, your organisation is helping to combat the climate crisis and the impacts of biodiversity loss.

Horticultural Excellence


